
Thank you, Lord, for all the partners of CBM, and for their endless commitment to fight for the most marginalised families. May the work they do be celebrated and have lasting impact.


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Heavenly Father, guide CBM in its initiative to promote inclusive education for children with disabilities by giving teachers the necessary support, training and resources.

We pray for swift action, effective distribution and lasting impact from the disaster relief efforts in Madagascar. May your love and provision be evident as lives are restored and communities rebuild.




