Every day, people in the world's poorest places become needlessly blind because of conditions that can be easily treated or prevented, like cataracts or glaucoma. Worldwide, an incredible three out of four people who are blind don't need to be. Millions more struggle to read, get around or earn a living because they don't have access to something as simple as a pair of glasses.

Many women, men and children in poverty have no access to the most basic of eye health services. And too often, if you live in a poor community, losing your sight also means losing the chance to go to school, live independently or earn a living. For those living on the edge, the impact is devastating - whole families pushed deeper into poverty and hunger.

At Christian Blind Mission, we believe that nobody should be blind just because they are poor.

Our work and ethos is based on and inspired by Christian values and the teaching and example of Jesus Christ. We are driven by the belief that all people are equally precious and valuable before God, and by Jesus' example of solidarity with and compassion for those who are marginalised and excluded.
