Jeanne, aged 55 years, lost her right leg, her mother lives with a physical disability, and her daughter is mentally impaired.
Jeanne is a member and chairperson of a savings group. She received a loan from her group, which she successfully used for growing and selling tomatoes.

We pray for the mentors who support these loan scheme members with advice and business knowledge, that they will be effective in helping to transform lives.



Jeanne plans to buy a goat with the profits from her tomato crop and expand her farming activities further to buy a new prosthesis. We pray for an ongoing blessing for Jeanne and mothers like her.
